Education came under heavy control in Nazi Germany. Adolf Hitler believed the youth of Germany could be totally indoctrinated to support the Volk—a nation made up of the most superior of the human races. This mass brainwashing was to be achieved in two ways: the transformation of the school curriculum, and the creation of bodies like the Hitler Youth.

The Reich Ministry of Education, Culture and Science took control of the education system in 1934, and while it didn't change the structure it inherited, it did major surgery on the staff. Jews were sacked en masse (and by 1938 Jewish children were barred from schools), teachers with rival political views were sidelined, and women were encouraged to start producing children rather than teach them. Of those who remained, anyone who didn't seem dedicated enough to the Nazi cause was retrained in Nazi ideas. This process was aided by the creation of the National Socialist Teachers League, with affiliation basically required in order to retain a job, as evidenced by a 97% membership rate in 1937. Grades suffered.

Once the teaching staff was organized, so was what they taught. There were two main thrusts of the new teaching: To prepare the population to better fight and breed, physical education was given much more time in schools. To better prepare children to support the state, Nazi ideology was given to them in the form of an exaggerated German history and literature, outright lies in science, and German language and culture to form the Volk. Hitler's "[Mein Kampf](#)" was heavily studied, and children gave Nazi salutes to their teachers as a show of allegiance.

By 1939, membership was compulsory for all children of the right age. The Hitler Youth is one of the most evocative Nazi organizations, visibly and effectively representing a regime that wanted to remake the whole of German society into a brutal, cold, quasi-medieval new world—and it was willing to start by brainwashing children.

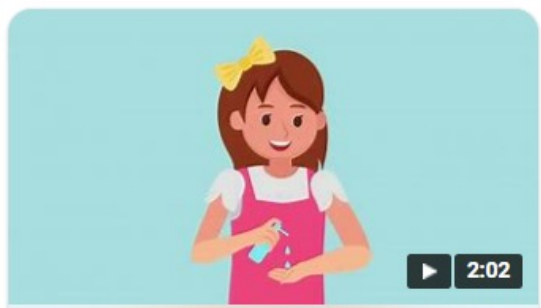

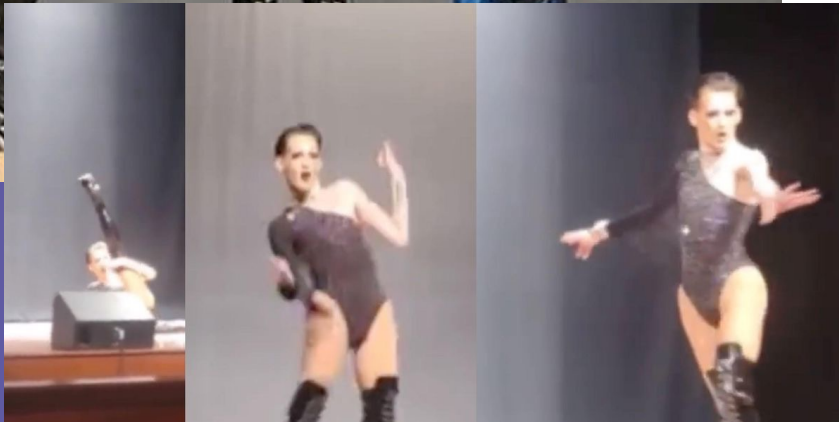

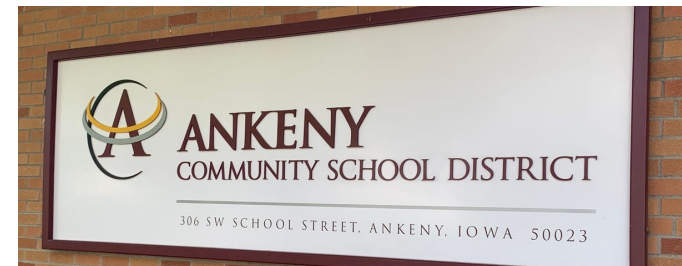

EDUCATORS AND ALLIES FIGHTING FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS

What's behind the latest attacks on teaching about race?

THE ANSWER IS PRIVATIZATION, AND OPPONENTS OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE DRAWING FROM THE SAME PLAYBOOK AS ALWAYS.

A hyperpartisan battle is being waged against efforts to provide students with an honest, rigorous education about race and racism in the United States. This is just the latest attack in a 50-year campaign to undermine public schools.

In the past decade alone, far-right pundits and policymakers have used topics such as climate change, gender identity, and race as key elements in their fabricated culture wars, often placing public schools in the middle. They've also pushed back against ethnic studies, bilingual education, and how schools serve transgender students.

But why? In the short term, ultra-conservative, big-money donors support candidates who use these issues to stoke voter fears and win elections. But they are also playing a long game: After fanning anti-public school sentiment, these policymakers move to cut public school budgets and push voucher schemes, another way to take resources out of public schools.

Today, this far-right, media-fueled campaign rages against an inclusive curriculum that ventures outside of White supremacist, heterosexual, male-dominated norms. Districts, schools, and even individual educators—who provide honest, age-appropriate lessons on these topics—have become targets at school board meetings and in state legislatures.

In June, after more than 25 states introduced or passed laws to censor teachers from speaking honestly about race and racism, NEA President Becky Pringle wrote in a USA Today op-ed: "These dangerous attempts to stoke fears and rewrite history not only diminish the injustices experienced by generations of Americans, they prevent educators from challenging our students to achieve a more equitable future. These antics are government overreach that interferes with teachers' ability to do their jobs and students' ability to learn and grow."

A new political action committee (PAC) launched in May—the first of its kind—will target school board elections around the country. The PAC specifically funds candidates who are opposed to teaching students about systemic racism. And grassroots efforts are springing up nationwide to back candidates solely based on their opposition to teaching critical race theory.

But you, in partnership with your union, can help thwart these harmful tactics. Read on to find out how.

Uncomfortable conversations

It's OK to be uncomfortable when talking about race and racism. "We're going to become an anti-racist society unless we have uncomfortable conversations," Mejia says. "We have to talk about what's going on in the world and we need to stop saying, we don't want to make you uncomfortable. I'm going to make you uncomfortable." ✦

When Frances Kraft, a Thompson-Rice resident in Charlotte, North Carolina, joined the Leaders of Color Pathway Project, she became a community ally.



NEA's Leaders for Just Schools program—a training in which educators learn to recognize bias and increase understanding. As part of the program, Kraft has helped train educators



on relationship-building when organizing for social and racial justice. She also leads restorative circles—a group activity that helps participants process thoughts and feelings.

As a community ally, Kraft can now bring resources and connections to schools without some of the limitations she had as a district employee.

"I can be more vocal about issues that relate to policies and work toward those changes in partnership with teachers," she says.

For Kraft, being an NEA member means she belongs to a big family of people working toward a common purpose.

"Anytime we can get away from working alone and join together to do the work, that's going to be an important part of how we move schools forward," Kraft says.

DECLARATION OF

mothers

A proclamation and a pledge for the preservation of
Liberty & Virtue

As the mothers, primary Makers of the Homes of America and molders of the future of our nation, we declare that the liberty and freedom of all people begin in the home and that a nation is but a magnified home. The values and virtues taught within the family will determine the values and virtues of the nation as a whole.

We recognize the sacred role of mother as the heart of the home and home as the heart of society. The liberty of each individual begins in the home and parents are, first and foremost, the primary teachers and protectors of their children in a free society. Properly constructed social, religious, and governmental institutions are designed to support and strengthen the family unit, not replace it or regulate it. No association or government organization can replace the family no matter how well-intentioned or well-designed it may be.

The privilege of living as a free people in a free society is dependent on being a people of faith, virtue and patriotism – the three pillars of liberty – and these attributes are best developed and nurtured in the home. Each generation has a responsibility to instill a love of liberty and virtue in the hearts of the next generation.

We affirm that "All men and women are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights and to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, [receiving their just powers from the consent of the governed]."

To secure the blessings of liberty, the Founding Fathers of the United States of America created a written constitution under the inspiration of Almighty God. The preservation of this sacred document and trust is dependent upon each generation who bears the stewardship of safeguarding the constitution and teaching their children the rights and responsibilities associated with the noble cause of liberty and keeping the Republic.

Every individual is born with intrinsic dignity that is inherent to each member of the human race. All men and women have the right to liberty, self-determination and self-governance. The individual's responsibility of work, education, and industry are crucial elements of self-governance in society and the preservation of human dignity.

The rights of a free people are protected and preserved through honorable, virtuous, leadership which invokes the nobility inherent in all men and women. Successful leaders in the home and family govern by correct principles, teach by example and stand for self-evident truths and liberty sustaining principles.

As the lessons of history clearly demonstrate, we recognize that freedom is fragile. It is a rare and prized possession and requires constant care and vigilance for its preservation. Living as a free people does not come instinctively; principles of freedom must be studied and applied. Home and families with mothers who nurture and teach these principles produce leaders who honor and hold sacred the intrinsic dignity of the individual and inalienable rights endowed to all people.

To safeguard the liberty and enhance the future of our children and grandchildren, we affirm our commitment to "stand fast in that liberty wherewith God has made us free" that "government of the people, by the people, and for the people shall not perish from the earth."
