Suggested Activity and Discussion for Kids

Depending on the size and makeup of your group, you may want to divide the children into age groups for the different activities.

Opening

- Prayer
- Pledge of Allegiance (located in the General Resource pdf) You can have one of the children hold a small flag or use a larger flag. This is a great opportunity to teach the children respect and proper care and folding of the flag.
- Recite Preamble to the U.S. Constitution (located in the General Resource pdf, doing this each day as a family will have your children memorizing it in no time at all.)

Theme Story & Discussion: We the Kids: The Preamble to the Constitution of the United States by David Catrow or A More Perfect Union: The Story of Our Constitution by Betsy Maestro and Giulio Maestro

Closing

- Read/Recite "The American's Creed" (located in the General Resource pdf)
- Prayer
- Announce the next month's theme and date/location for next Activity Day

Preparation and Materials Needed:

- Review the entire outline to consider how best to present the activities to each age group.
- Cut out the copies of the preamble and American's Creed to have on hand, or use copies from the previous Activity Day.
- Bring an American Flag for the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Borrow/purchase the book We the Kids: The Preamble to the Constitution of the United States by David Catrow or A More Perfect Union: The Story of Our Constitution by Betsy Maestro and Giulio Maestro.
- Ensure access to an electronic device will be available if you want to play the online knowledge games during the Activity Day, or purchase the physical games suggested in that section.
- Print out the word searches, crosswords, coloring pages and tricorn hat pages. You'll need extra white paper, crayons (and/or colored pencils, markers etc.), scissors, a stapler, and pens/pencils for these activities.
- Prepare food for snack time, and print page 5 with the Snack Time Constitution.

Theme Story & Discussion: We the Kids: The Preamble to the Constitution of the United States by David Catrow or A More Perfect Union: The Story of Our Constitution by Betsy Maestro and Giulio Maestro

Discussion prompt suggestions:

- 1. Why do you think it's important that we learn and remember what's in the Constitution?
- 2. What would be different in your life if you didn't have freedom?
- 3. Would we be here together right now?
- 4. What would you say to the men who wrote the Constitution if you could talk to them today?
- 5. What do you think they would say to you? How do you think they feel about you?
- 6. What do you do to show that you love being free?

Activity: Make tricorn hats!

Instructions and cutout pieces available through the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum (jfklibrary.org). Search "colonial couture" to download the pdf and watch a video tutorial. Before putting the hats together, ask each child three things they have learned or that they want to remember about the founding fathers and the constitution and write their answers on each side of the hat.

Before snack time explain that, as a group, you are going to set the following rules for snack time. Ask for input from the children to fill in the blanks, and then ask each person in the group to sign the bottom of the Snack Time Constitution.

Copy or print the example on the next page for Activity Day.

Explain to the children that your state Constitution and the national Constitution were created for the same reason you created the Snack Time Constitution. When everyone agrees on the same rules as a group, community, state, or nation, everyone can be treated fairly and have the chance to live better lives.

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






Instructions:


Print pages 6 and 7 on cardstock paper. Cut out the pictures to make 14 individual cards.

Shuffle the cards and lay them on the table, face down, in rows. The youngest player goes first. Play then continues in a clockwise direction. If they successfully match a pair they get to keep the cards, and that player gets another turn. If they don't match, turn them back over in the same spot. Person with the most matches wins!


